

JUNIOR WILDLIFE TECHNICIAN (BEAVER)

Terms of reference

POSITION

The Junior Wildlife Technician reports directly to the Wildlife Biologist but will cooperate with all personnel working on this project, both of FCC and of project partners.

PRIMARY ROLE:

- Assists in activities related to beaver reintroduction;
- Assists in activities for habitat improvement;
- Watches over release sites;
- Assists in monitoring of beaver sites;
- Carries out tasks and duties assigned by his/her supervisor;

SPECIFIC FOCUS:

- Participates in beaver translocations to project area;
- Patrols the beaver sites/area;
- Plants willows and poplars along the mountain rivers;
- Assists in scientific data collection and monitoring activities (camera traps);
- Observes and reports beaver behaviour;
- Informs local authorities and people about the importance of beaver;
- Carry out any other duties that may reasonably or exceptionally be required to ensure a smooth implementation of the ELP project activities;

QUALIFICATION AND SKILLS:

- At least medium hunting or forestry studies are required;
- Strong interest and good general knowledge about wildlife is required;
- Physical and mental fitness;
- Suitable for carrying weapon permits;
- Flexibility regarding working hours and travel;
- Must be able to use computers for editing documents and email;
- Driver's license;
