

Forest conservation and management



Activities

- Organised the public and private consultation for the Râul Târgului Management Plan, Argeşel, Râuşor Natura 2000 site.
- 48 ha of additional forest secured for full protection.
- Several spruce trees were illegally cut. The perpetrators were later identified, and legal action was taken. Our field team patrols to prevent such illegal activities.
- Due to heavy rains the mountain roads were eroded.













Ecological restoration



- We have begun the monitoring of the replanted surfaces, in order to measure the success and identify where we need to return to refill with saplings.
- We have fixed the fence that protects the largest restoration area CARPATHIA has on Vâlsanului Valley, to prevent the grazing of domestic animals.
- The grass is growing faster than the planted saplings. Soon, we will need to organise teams to cut the grass around it, so they don't get suffocated.
- Spruce and fir is growing fast in our greenhouse.
- Evaluation of the erosion tracks at Vâlsanului Valley and making plans to restore it.
- Field work on Dâmboviţa Valley: Identifying and mapping the riparian habitats, identifying three alien invasive species and the areas suitable for habitat restoration.
















Wildlife conservation



Activities

- We have started the DNA sampling of deer. Our objective is to collect 300 probes. So far, we have collected 15 samples, on 60 km. While hiking to collect samples, we "collect" human samples as well – waste left in the woods.
- We are in the process of authorising the rapid intervention team to solve human/wildlife conflicts: FCC rangers, county Gendarmerie and a veterinary will be on call on the wildlife concessions our project manages. A clear way of working will be disseminated within the local communities. In the meantime, our team is responding to the wildlife situation in the local communities.
- Patrols to prevent poaching and illegal fishing.



















Cobor Biodiversity Farm

- 25 new Grey Hungarian female cattle and one happy bull have freshened our heard. After a month long quarantine, they will enjoy the Cobor pastures; we have reached a "grey" number of 99 cattle!
- Local staff and a German volunteer, Mona, take care of all of the 49 horses from the Cobor horse accommodation & rehabilitation centre.
- We are glad to announce the birth of Tara-Sam in Cobor! He is the foal of the English Thoroughbred Cosimo and the Shagya Arab mare Opal.
- Three female Carpatin shepherd dogs have had puppies.
- The first alfalfa crop has been mowed.


