






United for people and nature

- Known for their scenic beauty and huge primary forests, the protected areas of the Ukrainian Carpathians have now become a shelter for refugees. Visitor centers, administrative buildings, and settlements in national parks are filling up with people who have fled their homes further east, searching for a safer place.
- Over the past few days, we have come together, working with the <u>Frankfurt Zoological Society</u> (FZS) and other partners, to provide support to the Ukrainian protected areas to tackle the new reality they face.
- We have organized two convoys with each over 3,5 t of food, tents, mattresses, blankets, clothes, hygiene products, heating systems to the administration of Protected Areas in the Ukrainain Carpathians.
- FZS and FCC will continue to respond to the needs of the protected areas, while we remain consistent in our nature protection and conservation activities in the Făgăraş Mountains.




















 26,693 ha of forest and pasture now have protected status under the CARPATHIA project.
















Ecological restoration

Wildlife conservation





 We have almost completed our wolf monitoring, with a total of 66 samples collected at the end of the month. We are pleased with these results and will see how much more we can manage to find in March, with the intermittent snow cover. We miss the freezing winters and heavy snow of the past.







Wildlife monitoring

- The field teams were busy with the monitoring of red and roe deer. In Dâmbovița Valley, species density has been rising since we bid for the first hunting concession in 2011 and the feeling is that numbers are more natural again. We had a pleasant surprise within the Management Unit 18, which we have managed since 2019, where we also found an abundant deer population. We are pleased that the protection measures we took have positive results. At first glance, it seems that the situation in our latest hunting concession in Nucsoara commune is still quite poor.
- We also prepare to restart the golden eagle monitoring with our project partner, <u>Milvus</u>.







- However cute the calves are, they are still wild animals. Our field team had to intervene on several occasions to remind tourists who wanted to get too close to the herd that they must keep a distance.
- We keep monitoring the three herds of free-ranging bison and we have signs we might have other calves later this year.





Wildlife management

- We have donated eight sheep to livestock owners that have lost sheep due to wolf attacks in the Rucăr and Dragoslavele area.
- With this voluntary compensation we help local farmers in a practical and unbureaucratic way, which is the core of our wildlife management philosophy.
- The rangers and the rapid intervention teams are present in the field and keep a close eye on the forest. Wild boars make their presence known near the villages and we want to prevent possible damage of crops and meadows.











Conservation Enterprise Programme



Food HUB

- Roadele Muntilor Food HUB
 continues its activity. We have more
 than 20 local producers and we
 intend to expand the activity,
 focusing on both business-to business and business-to-customer
 options.
- Whenever we have gourmand visitors, we encourage them to donate and try a tasty selection, ordering products and supporting both local producers as well as the forest conservation project.
- We deliver at a national level through Sameday courier service and soon you will find these products at Auchan in Piteşti.









Cobor Biodiversity Farm

- Our grandparents say that country air is good for the appetite. What would you say if you saw our grey cattle?
- The vet came for routine medical check-ups and the herd got their regular deworming treatment.
- The first donation in 2022 of Carpathian shepherd dogs was finalised. These beautiful four females have started their new lives within other farms in the Făgăraş Mountains.
- All the horses are doing well, especially Bella, who turned 19. She got carrots and apples and a tuneful Happy Birthday.





Cobor Biodiversity Farm

- Cobor is open for guests in search of a quiet place. Local cake recipes and other dishes are always appreciated. Amongst a few guests and some teambuilding – don't forget we do have great facilities for companies, not only for individuals.
- The story of the farm and of the Carpathian shepherd dogs' breeding programme will be live this spring at Radio France International. Thank you for the visit!









- We now have all the legal requirements in place, needed by The Veterinary Directorate, and will soon start operating our own local slaughterhouse.
- We have hired a butcher/farm assistant. We are convinced by the taste and quality of our beef, but now is the time for many more to try it.
- Before the snow fell, we managed to clear 45 ha of pastures. This year we will use less diesel, as we have installed a 3,000 I reservoir.

• We have finished the training of the next generation of guides for nature based experiences at our four wildlife hides and glamping experiences.

This summer we will host numerous camps for children, thus we need more wonderful 'green' teachers, to accommodate the high request for such activities.
- 20 participants enjoyed the 3 full day programme and look forward to applying the concepts with the centre's visitors.







- With the pandemic numbers still being high, our presence at events is mainly online.
- We participated in the conference organized by the Ţara Făgărașului Community Foundation about 'Developing the capacity of NGOs in Ṭara Făgărașului'.



- At the invitation of the high school students from Youth Bank Făgăraş, who are eager to get involved in green projects, we have met online and talked about how the planting process works and what conditions must be met to ensure the success of a new forest.
- We are glad that this spring we will have a lot of help from the young to restore the secular oak pastures in the vicinity of the Cobor Biodiversity Farm.

 involve locals to make decisions regarding
 the communities' future.


