

Forest conservation and management




There are a myriad of reasons why we need a National Park in the Făgăraș Mountains.

Preserving this rich natural diversity is essential to our survival.













Ecological restoration

In March we will return to the Groapele area, but also to other ecological reconstruction sites severely affected by illegal logging in the past in the Făgăraş Mountains.

Wildlife conservation



Wildlife monitoring

- February was the best moment to monitor the wolves, as the winter finally settled into the Făgăraş Mountains.
- Our colleagues have travelled for miles along the wolves' trails to find fresh samples of excrement, urine or hair. Fresh, meaning no older than five days, so they contain relevant genetic information.
- Winters have become milder and milder. With the earlier lack of snow, monitoring wolves became a big challenge for our team.








 Despite the lack of snow during the first part of winter, we managed to collect a total of 85 samples by the end of the month – still a bit of work left to reach our target of 250 samples.

Did You Know?

Winter is an active period for wolves.

All members of a pack regroup to patrol their territories as it is also breeding time. It is also the time when some of the offspring will start to disperse and explore other areas.

In this period wolves are often at an advantage when hunting large prey such as wild boar, red deer and roe deer. Their strategy is to pursue prey over a longer distance – a very exhausting game in deep snow.









Wildlife reintroductions

- The number of bison in the Făgăraş Mountains increased in February with six new individuals arriving from Slovakia. We currently have twelve bison in the Nucşoara acclimatization enclosure, which we will release in the spring.
- A total of 36 bison in five different herds already roam freely.

Wildlife reintroductions

 We are working to obtain all permits required to reintroduce beavers from the Elbe River, Germany, to increase the genetic diversity of our Romanian population.









Wildlife management

- The rapid intervention teams are present in the field and keep a close eye on the forest. Brown bears have already started to make their presence known near the villages and we want to prevent possible damage or conflicts.
- We collect samples, identify the bears and work on some innovative intervention tools to avoid conflicts.






