



Forest conservation and management




During September we were able to purchase a further 3.25 ha of land, fully protected for future generations.

Ecological restoration

- In September, we restored the forest floor on more than 1,000 metres of logging tracks at the Groapele restoration site.
- We have started preparing for the autumn planting season; which is usually short. We are hoping for good weather conditions so that we can replant 50 hectares of forest.



Green houses and tree nurseries

- Thanks to our great local employee, we weed by hand. We never use herbicides or pesticides.
- After the final weeding of the season, we took an inventory of the saplings in our nurseries.
- We plan to use saplings from our own nurseries for this autumn's planting.





Removing the invasive alien (IAS) plant species

- We continued our efforts to eradicate invasive alien species. We focused on daisy fleabane (*Erigeron annuus*) and Japanese knotweed (*Reynoutria japonica*) in the Dâmboviței and Dragoslovenilor valleys, and cleared over 15 km.
- To monitor progress, we carried out fixed-point photography and botanical surveys in five sample areas along the Dâmboviţa valley.
- The results are encouraging! Due to CARPATHIA's ongoing removal efforts in previous years, we have seen a reduction in invasive alien plant cover compared to 2022.

- We have initiated the first round of monitoring on 10 plots, at the Groapele ecological restoration site. Our focus is on assessing the impact of restoration activities on degraded habitats and tracking changes in understory vegetation cover.
- Athyrium distentifolium a rare subalpine fern species was identified by our biologist at a new site in our project area.
- Our biologist also discovered a new site for the EU Habitats Directive listed species *Tozzia carpathica* in the Dragoslovenilor valley. This species thrives in well-preserved alder valley corridors.

Wildlife reintroductions

- Six new bison arrived in the Făgăraş Mountains. Four of them are in the Lereşti enclosure and two in the Nucşoara enclosure. The 6 specimens come from reserves in Germany. After the quarantine and acclimatisation period, they will be released into the wild to form new herds.
- The reintroduction and release areas are far away from villages and are carefully studied to provide optimal living and feeding conditions for the species.





Wildlife monitoring

- Intensive red deer monitoring has reached a high point. The completion of 127 camera trap checks and the final red deer DNA sampling season, has resulted in the collection of 60 scat samples. We would like to thank the wildlife monitoring team and our invaluable volunteers for their tireless efforts.
- We have started our new winter monitoring of the Eurasian lynx.
 Camera traps are being strategically placed in the field by our team and the CARPATHIA Rangers. This will bring a promising and deeper understanding of temporal changes in the lynx population.



Wildlife monitoring

- We installed camera traps to help monitor <u>the red deer rut</u>.
- From September through to October our rangers spent a lot of time in the field monitoring the red deer rut. They could hear a lot of roaring males with the valleys full of life again.



Wildlife management

- During the last months, brown bears have caused severe damage to livestock in local communities at the edge of our wildlife concessions. The reasons are complex and reflect a lot of issues in global warming and different land-use.
- In response to these incidents, our intervention teams were out in the field continuously, working tirelessly to keep the bears away from villages. They also installed electric fences at identified hotspots to minimize conflict and increase community safety as a proactive measure. Furthermore, we tested an AI-based alarm system to detect bear activity.
- These efforts underline our commitment to balancing the coexistence of wildlife and local communities in our conservation project.

International visits


