






Protected forests

In the forest, trees are sprouting and blossoming, animals are working to build dens and nests, preparing for the next generation of offspring. While patrolling, our colleagues frequently spotted wild animals.







Not all is green

Out of the almost 500,000 saplings planted in the spring of 2023, a small percentage seem to be suffering. Possible causes are mice and excess heat.





Leaota

It makes us sad to report that sometimes our rangers find tree stumps, like this one, left after a sycamore tree was cut.

Sycamore (*Acer pesudoplatanus*) is already a rare species, making up for less than 5% of all the trees in the forest. We have alerted the authorities.

Replanting sites



The Groapele area in the south of the Făgăraș Mountains is one of the most challenging replanting sites.

It is situated at a high altitude, which makes access difficult; because it has been clear cut in the past, it presents eroded areas with no trees left to protect the new saplings.

We have been planting here since 2019, and in May we completed our target of 100,000 saplings planted for this spring, with the final 25,000 being spruce saplings.







Work is peaking in our nurseries. We watered and weeded saplings of all ages, preparing them for the sun and the mountain that awaits.





A group of students from the Northeastern University in Boston, USA, visited and volunteered for field activities. To help them understand hands-on how we work, we involved them in tasks such as: eliminating foreign invasive plants and identifying plant species that are interesting for ecotourism – medicinal, edible or of conservation value.


During their visit, students also spent a field day with our Wildlife Monitoring team, learning about the local fauna and the methods we use to study them.











Red deer monitoring

After recording the activity of red deer for a whole year, in June our monitoring cameras will be brought back, the data will be retrieved and analysed. In May, after the snow disappeared, the team revisited around 30% of the camera traps, some placed at high altitude.








A new study

We are preparing an acoustic study in collaboration with British Trust for Ornithology. The monitoring devices detect sounds in the audible spectrum but also ultrasound emitted by bats.

Through this pilot study we collect data about birds, bats and crickets from three types of areas:

- traditionally managed forests now included in a conservation regime
- former clear-cuts that are being reconstructed or in an early stage of growth
- virgin forests.

This way we can see the impact of our reconstruction work on biodiversity. We have installed 23 devices and are looking forward to seeing (or to be more precise, hearing) the data they collect.



Wild Boar

The wild boar alert system developed together with Cambridge University is being tested. In May we installed four cameras in the area of Albeşti commune, situated in the south of the Făgăraş Mountains. The objective is to have a functional system that alerts our rangers about the presence of wild boar and their number.



Happy news from the beaver homes: we noticed signs that two of the beaver families, which we have relocated in Dâmboviţa valley, in the eastern part of the Făgăraş Mountains, have cubs now.





Bears have noticed one of our camera traps and taken it off the tree. Fortunately, all cameras are protected by a solid case, so it was not damaged. Our colleagues could pin it to a different tree, in a discreet place.







Conservation Enterprise Programme

Roadele Munților



In the beginning of May we celebrated Orthodox Easter. The local producers baked a local type of sweet bread and honoured the orders placed through the Roadele Munților food hub.



We are prepared for summer: artisanal syrups made with local ingredients are ready to be mixed with ice-cold water and become a delicious refreshment.

Roadele Munților is a food collection and distribution centre (Food Hub) through which we bring the products of small traditional producers from the Făgăraș Mountains to your tables. Some of the products are already available at Ferma Cobor, but the full range can be found on the website, where you can order online.

Meet Dieter's bread



Dieter's bread is one of the local producers in the Roadele Munților food hub. Located in Câmpulung Muscel, a small town in the south of the Făgăraș Mountains, it is famous for the bread and sweets baked in the wood-fired oven, that gives it a unique taste.



The bread is made with quality flour and a lot of love. Our guests who tasted it at the Richita Centre for Activities and Nature Exploration, at Poiana Tămaș or at the Cobor Farm have been impressed by the richness and authenticity of the taste.



Dieter's bread also bakes an exquisite 'cozonac', the local sweet bread, full of flavours and guaranteed to bring you back, asking for more!











Visit to Sibiu with local producers

We visited the Ecotourism National Fair which took place in May at the Astra open-air Museum, in Sibiu. We were accompanied by some of the producers in the Roadele Munților food hub. Seeing their interest in connecting with the public and learning how to expand their businesses makes us proud!

We also discussed with some of the producers who were present at the fair the opportunity to collaborate and tasted their local products.





Our activity at the Roadele Munților food hub is an inspiration. We were present at the Food & Beverage Innovation Camp in Sovata, Mureș county, in a dual role: as providers and as speakers.

As providers, we catered with Transylvanian Grey cattle meat for the traditional dish, goulash, and with Carpathia eco-certified beer.

As speakers, we talked about our activity to encourage all producers, but also to spread the news about our products to a greater public.



Cobor Biodiversity Farm

More than 65 calves were born this year in the Transylvanian Grey cattle herd. It counts 280 heads at the moment.





Travel Carpathia

Besides tourism, we also offer the possibility for university groups to visit, learn about the rich nature of the Făgăraș Mountains and exchange knowledge in a fairytale landscape. A group of students and teachers from Eberswalde University for Sustainable Development visited us. Our skilled guides took them on nature hikes and offered their in-depth knowledge about the local biodiversity.


















Wildlife hides are well visited by those who love adventures off the beaten track. Some guests already enjoyed great experiences and sightings, including the UK Ambassador for Romania.

The project has won the art competition 'Manifesto for Făgăraș Mountains' against 14 other proposals.






Table tennis tournament

We were happy to take part in the Job Fair at the Faculty of Biology in Bucharest. We met promising students and talked to them about our projects, giving them an idea about what nature conservation entails.





- We organised a field workshop on ecologic reconstruction with highschool students from Rucăr.
- They learned about specific restoration activities and their impact.
- The surprise of the day was the presence of Ruben Valbuena, a university lecturer from Sweden, who presented new technologies for monitoring forests, like drones and 3D scanners.
- The event was organised as part of the SUPERB project (Systemic solutions for upscaling of urgent ecosystem restoration for forest-related biodiversity and ecosystem services).

One of our wildlife laboratory specialists, Mădălina, taught the youth in the Junior Ranger programme how to process and analyse biological samples.








Fundraising workshop


At the National Fundraising Conference Barbara and Christoph Promberger, our executive directors, shared their expertise on attracting support for great causes with other NGOs.





Partnership with Casa Bună


